

Importing Personal Property Into Tanzania

IMPORTING HOUSEHOLD GOODS AND PERSONAL EFFECTS

REQUIRED DOCUMENTS:

- Original passport with visa
- Valid resident or original working permit
- Detailed inventory in English dated, valued in USD and signed by the shipper (3 copies)
- Packing list
- Original Bill of Lading/AWB
- Letter from the employer explaining that the shipper is starting a new contract
- Invoices for the electrical and hi fi appliances and for all the items bought less than 6 months before shipper's arrival. Serial numbers must be provided for all major appliances

Note:

- There are no excise or import duties on used household goods provided they are exported before the expiration of the shipper's temporary residence permit.
- All documents must be express mailed 21 days before shipment's arrival in order for the shipper's employer to apply for the possible duty-free exemption certificate.
- Diplomatic shipments are not bound to customs examinations upon presentation of the P.R.O 6 from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs in Tanzania
- Non diplomatic shipments should be accompanied with a Resident Permit to avoid any taxes

IMPORTING MOTOR VEHICLES:

- Shipper may import one car tax-free if has been owned for more than one year
- Chassis number and weight must be listed on Original Bill of Lading

REQUIRED DOCUMENTS:

- Original registration card
- Original Passport
- Original Bill of Lading
- Original invoice of car
- Non sale Certificate
- Certificate of vehicle safety

RESTRICTED/PROHIBITED ITEMS:

- Firearms and ammunition
- Unlawful drugs
- Elephant tusk
- Minerals
- Medicines
- Grains
- Animals
